IV. Curriculum Vitae

(Laudation at the ceremony to confer the title of honorary professor to Professor Martin Tielen at the Wroclaw University of Environmental and Life Sciences in November 2009 in Poland.)

Professor Martin Tielen – an outstanding Dutch specialist on pig health and behaviour, animal welfare and well-being, epizootics, safety of feed and food and sustainability of animal feed. Unquestioned authority in animal and veterinary sciences, author or co-author of over 200 publications in prestigious journals, 13 books and chapters published in English and German in the Netherlands, Germany and the US. Invited speaker in more than 20 foreign countries all over the world.

Martin Tielen was born on 22 September 1942 in Horst-Meterik, the Netherlands. In 1969 he graduated from the department of Zootechnics at the Agricultural University of Wageningen. In 1974 he defended his doctoral thesis on "*Incidence and prevention by animal care of lung*"

and liver affections in swine'. In 1985 he gained the degree of a professor at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the Utrecht University.

Prof Tielen's research comprised several subject areas. One of them was the integrated quality control in pigs, focused on pig health and welfare. He investigated the effects of environmental conditions on animal health. Besides, he investigated epizootic issues and their impact on the incidence and control of *Pseudorabies and Salmonella sp.* in pigs, lesions in the respiratory system due to adverse environmental conditions, the effects of endotoxins on respiratory diseases and others. Worth noting are his investigations on diseases commonly found in veterinarians and pig breeders, such as allergies, lung diseases, brucellosis, etc. The third subject area covered by Prof Tielen was connected with safety and sustainability of animal feed production. His publications were focused on: impact of animal housing on animal disease incidence, integrated quality control in animal production, herd health monitoring and control programs, health risks for animal breeders and veterinarians, safety in animal nutrition, HACCP in industries manufacturing feed ingredients, sustainability of feeding technologies and the role of genetically modified products.

Prof Tielen actively contributed to training of young researchers, was a supervisor and reviewer of 16 doctoral theses at home and abroad. He actively participated in many conferences and has gained reputation as an excellent organizer, academic and scientist. From 1987-1995 was he deputy director of the Animal Health Service in the Southern Netherlands responsible for Research and Development and ICT. From 1995–2002 he was a strategic adviser at the Animal Health Service in the Netherlands. Since 1992 he has been a member of the Executive Board of ISAH (International Society of Animal Hygiene), in 1997-2000 its chairman and in 2000 the organizer of the X International Congress of Animal Hygiene in Maastricht. Since 2000 he has been the President of the Prof Tielen Fund- Foundation, providing support to young researchers in the developing countries, allowing them to participate in ISAH congresses. To the date, the Prof Tielen Fund has awarded grants to 85 young scientists, including academics and doctoral students of the Wroclaw University of Environmental and Life Sciences.

In 2000 Prof Martin Tielen retired and since then he has been Professor Emeritus of the State University of Utrecht. In 2000–2008 he was a member of the Evaluation Committee of the Association of Establishments for Veterinary Education and visited veterinary faculties in many European countries, including Poland.

In 2000-2006 Prof Martin Tielen was the President of the Netherlands Feed Industry Association (NEVEDI), representing all feed enterprises in the Netherlands, manufacturing 15 million tonnes of animal compound feed per annum. From June 2004 to July 2007, Prof Tielen was the President of the European Federation of Feed Manufacturers (FEFAC), representing 23 associations of animal feed manufacturers in EU member states. Since 2002 Prof Tielen is member of the Supervisory Board of the Rabobank and member of the steering committee of Food & Agri Principles. He was in all member of 23 major Dutch and international associations and scientific boards, directly or indirectly connected with the hygiene of agricultural production.

Worth attention are Prof Tielen's close links with the scientific community of Wrocław and a number of his visits to the Wroclaw University of Environmental and Life Sciences, where he participated in international conferences organized by the Faculty of Biology and Animal Science and the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine. He received the title of honorary professor at this university in November 2009.

V. ISAH-Activities

Prof Martin Tielen visited the events of ISAH (International Society for Animal Hygiene) for the first time at the "In-between" symposium in September 1977 organised by Prof Thomas Janowski in Krakow, Poland. He presented a lecture about the results of his PHD-thesis regarding lung- and liver affections in fattening pigs. He participated for the first time in an International Congress on Animal Hygiene of ISAH in Vienna in 1980. Since that time he visited all 13 next congresses and 7 in between symposia. He presented all together 28 papers in this congresses and symposia. The first time that Prof Tielen attended an Executive Board meeting of ISAH was in 1990 in Eberswalde, Germany, to prepare the 7th congress on animal hygiene in 1991 in Leipzig.

He was elected as 2nd vice president in 1994 in Minnesota with the task to organise the X congress on Animal Hygiene in the Netherlands in 2000. For that reason he was elected as President of ISAH in 1997 at the congress in Helsinki succeeding Prof Saloniemi, who organised an excellent congress in Finland. During the preparation of the congress in Maastricht in 2000 the Professor Tielen Fund Foundation was established by the organising committee of the congress to give young scientists from developing countries the opportunity to attend the congresses with a substantial financial support. This Fund is still continuing his activities in this regard. The 100st PTF-student was awarded in 2011 at the congress in Vienna, Austria. The X congress in Maastricht in the Netherlands was a big success. Over 280 congress participants and 30 accompanying persons attended the congress. The best poster award was conferred to Dr. Peter Kunc from Czech Republic. The participants became one big family at the exciting final farewell party in a typical Dutch environment.

Professor Tielen was elected as 1st vice president after this congress. He started the discussion about the future of ISAH at the Executive Board Meeting in Acapulco in Mexico in 2002 with the discussion paper: "The way forward for ISAH". After several debates in the Executive Board and in the General Assembly in the following years this discussion was finalised in the new structure of ISAH included in the new statutes.

Prof Tielen stayed in the Executive Board as member at large and for a short period as treasurer. He resigned in the General Assembly at the congress in Vechta, Germany in 2009 after serving the society as Executive Board Member for about 20 years. He will still continue his work in the PTF related to ISAH in the coming years.

Prof Tielen was awarded as Honorary Member of ISAH at the General Assembly in 2011 in Vienna, Austria.
