Dear members of ISAH, colleagues and friends around the world,

Again, I have to start also this ISAH newsletter, which reach you just before Christmas and before the end of the year, with SARS-Cov-2 issues. The losses of lives and the economic damage this pandemic has caused and is still causing are immeasurable. The far-reaching effects can often only be illustrated by some statistic figures and examples breaking new records day after day. Confirmed total global Covid-19 cases have surpassed the number of 272 million and more than 5.3 million people died by and with COVID-19 (16 December 2021, JHU). Nearly 8.6 billion vaccine doses have been administered but the pandemic is still there and threatens with new mutants the social and economic life in so many countries. This pandemic shows how vulnerable our modern way of life is. Beyond the pure numbers of infections, diseases and deaths, which are constantly reaching new, terrifying heights, there is a series of often neglected collateral damages.

As an example. In the COVID-19 year 2020, about 627,000 people died of malaria worldwide. That were 69,000 more casualties compared with the average of the years before. Two third of this additional death toll (45,540) is attributed to COVID-19 because malaria prevention and treatment programs were interrupted and services could not be provided.

First priority in the fight against COVID-19 and its mutants is vaccination. Second, convince the coronavirus skeptics and all

those who are in doubt. Vaccination saves lives, reduces suffering and protects from severe course of disease in the majority of cases. Third, it is crucial to apply all hygienic rules and measures like breathing masks, disinfection, distance and ventilation of rooms. And forth - re-think the relationship between man, animal and nature. One-Health does not only refer to diseases of man and animal, it includes nature and its atmosphere, water and fertility of soils on our whole planet. Some people call it planetary health. The persistent pandemic reminds us to further develop and establish "healthy human societies". This requires health monitoring of man and farm animals and early warning systems for infectious diseases around the world. It requires further a better understanding of hygienic principles and measures, which should contain permanent as well as fast reaction strategies that are understood by citizens. Once and again, sharing knowledge and skills (capacity building) must be part of such a strategy in the field of human and animal hygiene.

Let me briefly raise the upcoming diagnostic tool tele-veterinary-medicine. It was progressing already with the spread of digitalization in livestock farming, particularly for pig and poultry vets. The COVID-19 pandemic with all its restrictions in movement and visiting farms gave it a boost. This technology will alter the way of everyday healthcare in farms. Remotely prepared veterinary care can improve hygiene and biosecurity. A crisis like COVID-19 can also be the trigger for a departure to new shores and prosperous developments in livestock farming.



His doctoral work resulted in a Observational dissertation entitled Experimental Studies of the Influence of Housing Factors on the Behaviour and Health of Dairy Cows. Since 2007 he was an associate professor and in 2008 he was appointed senior lecturer in animal hygiene.

His main interests are housing environment, health, welfare and productivity, primarily in dairy cattle, applied veterinary epidemiology, and animal and human welfare. He has received several awards for his work in Animal welfare research, as well as for his teaching or vet students and other animal science students. 

In December 2021, a second volume of Brazilian animal welfare regulations "Compandium animalis, Anexos" with over 1000 pages was published. The volume brings together almost all of the tangible appendices on animal welfare regulations in Brazil. It follows the "Compendium animalis" of 2020, which contains all legal provisions. The texts of both volumes were compiled to a large extent and primarily by Dr. Stefan Timm. Prof. Jörg Hartung, University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover and Prof. Paulo Maiorka, University of Sao Paulo are co-authors. The provisions are reproduced in the Portuguese original language. It is the very first compilation of animal welfare-related legal regulations and their appendices in Brazil.

Proceedings of 72th Annual Meeting of the European Federation of Animal Science (EAAP)

The congress was held in the city of Davos (Switzerland) from **29**th **August to 3**rd **September 2021.** For the first time, a hybrid congress was held and around 800 participants have been on site and 400 took part virtually in the meeting this year.

The meeting hosted scientists and experts from the field of animal science, not only from Europe but also from other countries around the globe. The EAAP Congress provided insights into the latest research results from many areas of animal science.

Every year, the Annual meeting is a unique opportunity for scientists and industry to meet and acquire new knowledge and to exchange experience. Carried out through many sessions, plenary meeting, a poster and exhibition presentations, and discussions about scientific achievements in the European and world livestock production, the 70th Annual Meeting gave another opportunity for the application of new ideas in practice. All these preferences make the EAAP one of the largest animal science congresses in the world.

The next congress will be held in Porto (Portugal) in September from 5th to 9th 2022.



European Symposium of Porcine Health Management (ESPHM)



The ESPHM is a joint collaboration among three parties including the European College of Porcine Health Management (ECPHM), the European Association of Porcine Health Management (EAPHM) and the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) including the University of Veterinary Medicine Budapest and the Hungarian Association of Porcine Health Management and Hungarian Association of Porcine Health Management.

The ESPHM in Budapest will be the 13th edition of the symposium, representing the complete consolidation of a meeting that started in Copenhagen (Denmark) in 2009 with 220 delegates. Since then, the congress has evolved at all levels, with more than 1,900 delegates in the most recent edition in Barcelona, Spain, in 2018. This is an evident proof of the increasing interest that the scientific contents of the ESPHM offers, not only for European veterinarians but also to the international community. Although settled in Europe, the ESPHM aspires to be a source of updated knowledge and knowhow in its field for the whole world.
